We offer music lessons in school as extra-curricular activities during the school day (please note children are taken out of class for these lessons). We have various providers, and most are direct book, so please contact the school office for details.

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Checking for COVID:

Please do not use Lateral Flow home tests to check for COVID when your child has any suspected symptoms (including a temperature, cough, loss of taste/smell). The Government guidance states if someone has suspected symptoms, they should use a PCR test to confirm if it is COVID. A Lateral Flow home test is for routine asymptomatic (no symptoms) testing only and is currently not recommended for Primary age children.

Get a coronavirus test - GOV.UK (test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk).

If anyone in your household has suspected symptoms, the household must self-isolate for 10 days and seek a PCR test for the symptomatic person.

Please do tell us if there is a positive case so we can take appropriate actions to inform others and protect the community as a whole. Thank you.

We will always inform the school community if there is a positive case in school, and any further actions they may need to take. We will not share any personal details when we need to do this, in line with data protection rules.

The County Council have also asked us to make sure all parents are aware they can claim a **Test & Trace Payment** if they have to self-isolate, are then unable to work and meet certain other income related criteria – you don't necessarily have to be in receipt of benefits to be eligible! Chicks in Nursery

Kapok Tree – Rainforests and Deforestation in Y4



The children in Year 4 have been using the book 'The Kapok Tree' to inspire their learning over the last few weeks. This included creating their own rainforest, and then experiencing deforestation and the destruction of their creation.

They have also written letters to the Prime Minister asking for him to take action on the issue.









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E-Safety: YouTube

YouTube can be a fantastic place to find entertainment and learn about almost anything, but for children there can be risks and dangers.

In school we often use child-friendly videos from YouTube as part of learning activities, with appropriate controls in place to keep everyone safe.

It has come to our attention that some children in our school have their own YouTube accounts and are publishing videos online. The current Terms and Conditions allow for children under 13 to have an account, but only with their parent's consent AND parents must accept full responsibility for the actions of their children online.

This is to protect them from:

- Mean comments and cyber bullying
- Being watched by strangers
- Revealing personal details such as their location or name
- Being embarrassed by old videos when they grow up
- Making themselves look vulnerable to people with bad intentions
- Their content being misused by others (once it is published online, you lose absolute control of it)

We would recommend that for children in primary school it is not necessary for them to have their own account, because doing so leaves your child at greater risk. We also recommend that children never post videos of themselves, or other children.

However if you believe that they have something to share, or you wish to provide your child access to YouTube, then we strongly encourage you to make sure that the parent/carer is in control of the account.

Adults should:

- Be in charge of the account (so you can see all account activity, and control the settings for publishing, sharing, commenting etc.)
- Turn off comments (to prevent unkind comments their friends can send them a message another way)
- Make it private so that only people you know in person can view content (control the use of the video)
- Make sure names are not used (protect your child's identity and location)

Finally, we need to be very clear that school's ability to intervene when something goes wrong on social media is limited. We will always do what we can, but it remains parents' responsibility to monitor, and control, their child's use of online devices and services at home.
