Black History Month at All Saints



Over the last two weeks the children have been learning and thinking about the role Black History plays in our society. In assembly, the children learned about Clive Sullivan. He was the first black captain of any British sports team to represent his Country at an international and national level. He played for Hull and Hull Kingston Rovers – both Rugby League teams. He was renowned for his speed and power, and is named as a role model for lots of athletes who followed him. The husband of one of our members of staff won the Clive Sullivan Cup while at University for their sporting achievements.



On Friday last week, parents and friends came in to lead workshops with the children. In Reception the children made Brazilian Cheese Bread (Pao de Queijo). They had lots of fun mixing the ingredients and rolling the balls, before baking enough for everyone to try – delicious!!

Y1 and Y2 combined to learn about Kente patterns from Ghana. They looked at the material and learned about the patterns and colours. Afterwards, they made some of their own using paint and combs, and weaving coloured paper.



Y3 and Y4 learned about AfroBeat dancing, and practiced a sequence. It looked great fun and the music really got feet (and arms, legs, and bodies!) moving. It was great to watch a group perform the routine in Celebration Assembly.





Y6 learned about the process of making Kente Cloth, and how the material is an important part of the life story. Each colour has meaning, and is woven together to tell the story. They also learned about how the making process inspires music, and the origins of the patterns.

The children in Y5 have enjoyed their Mini-police project. Last week they explored bullying and cyber-bullying, thinking about what it is, how to prevent it, and what to do if they thought they were being bullied.
