I hope you are well and keeping safe! The end of lockdown is in sight, and there is the glimmer of hope for the relaxing of restrictions later this year in the summer. Already, as I'm sure you will be too, I'm beginning to think of the things we will be able to do if... when...

But we've a little way to go before then, and as the saying goes – best not to put the cart before the horse!!

We have been very busy since Monday planning for the return of all pupils on 8th March, and I hope to have the information and details ready to send out tomorrow. The guidance has made it clear that all measures in place over the Autumn will be remaining, with the added measure of twice weekly staff testing.

However, this time – with the potential for improved weather in Spring, and now we have a Sports Coach in place, I am currently liaising with them for the return of our sports after school. We are also discussing options with Sewing Club, Art Explorers, Computer Explorers and Hip Hop. Watch this space and look out for any surveys or flyers in the coming weeks if you're interested. Restrictions will be in place, as you'd expect, and this may limit some of the activities, and some may not start until after Easter – but something is better than nothing!!

Over half term, I hope you were able to try some of the things I suggested to occupy the time – I never quite know if they're welcome or not, but sometimes it's better to have more ideas than you need than none at all!


<u>Parent Consultations – Monday to Friday, 4pm – 5pm next week</u>

World Book Day - 3rd - 5th March

This year, the theme is 'Sharing a story'.

We'd like to challenge all the children to see how many people they can share a story with – remotely of course! Pick a favourite book or section of a book (or a different one for each person!) and get in touch with family and friends online – read a story to them. You could even have a 'virtual' bed time story session.



We're also preparing a 'Masked Reader' challenge – several members of staff will read a short bit of a story in a disguise of some form, and the challenge is to guess who it is! We're having fun making the videos – so hopefully you'll enjoy the finished thing too!







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The teachers will be planning a few other bits and pieces too for the remote learning sessions next week, so do look out for those.

We've received the vouchers and will send these out when the children are all back in school. Unfortunately, the World Book Day organisers may have forgotten there is a pandemic on at the moment, so the vouchers last until 28th March and can only be spent in person at a book shop (all closed!) or supermarket! Booksellers will honour the voucher after the 28th March while stocks last.



I suggest you look online to see the free books available from your supermarket of choice at home, pick one out together and then follow the Covid Rules and Guidance to purchase it in person on your next visit. You might also be able to contact the seller to see if they will accept the vouchers online. You can also wait until book shops open again, and chance them still having stock — they will honour the vouchers until stocks run out.

You may be aware that the Government launched a new statutory curriculum for Relationships and Sex Education for all schools from the Summer Term 2021. We have been working hard to prepare for this and wanted to share with parents at home what this might mean for their children and offer a chance to comment.

We will be sending out a consultation survey in the next few weeks and would encourage parents to respond. Some elements of the RSE curriculum are already included in the Science and PSHE curriculum we are already following, whereas others are separate and new. The consultation will help parents to understand better our curriculum plans for RSE and enable you to comment on them.


