Y4 Archaeological Dig

Year 4 was very fortunate to have LP Archaeologists in school to see what treasures they could uncover on our field. As they have been studying Bishops Stortford this term, they had all been wondering what was in our school grounds before we were here. The children were very enthusiastic as they learnt how to prepare a site, health and safety and also how to dig properly to ensure they preserved the artefacts. Although the ground was extremely hard, they managed to find pieces of pottery, wood, fossilised animal material and lots of rocks and flint! The children managed to dig down to about 30cm which takes us back about 100 years! On the Friday, the Archaeologists came back to show the class some interesting finds from previous sites as well as bag up and classify our own finds.

Thank you to all the staff at LP Archaeologists for your support and knowledge, we think there are some budding archaeologists for the future and some have even now attempted to dig up their own garden

(with parental permission, of course!)
