In terms of English, we will now be using a 'Talk for Writing' booklet. Our booklet includes a story called Sayeeda, the Pirate Princess. This includes lots of different activities; however, I will specify in the home learning which ones to look at and have a go at each week.

In school, we will also be looking at a different theme every week. This could be anything from an author or artist, to a film clip or a picture. This week everyone will be looking at an artist. As a result, Year Two will be looking at the work of Kandinsky. Kandinsky was an abstract artist who would use lots of different shapes and bright colours to create his pieces.



I have therefore suggested a couple of different activities that could be completed, linked to this theme. Choose your favourite to have a go at.

This sheet is called 'Block Diagrams' and involves looking at graphs and answering questions about them.


