UNIFORM POLICY

At All Saints we want our school uniform to promote a sense of pride in our school and to engender a feeling of belonging. School uniform identifies the children with the school, makes children feel equal to one another in terms of appearance and is not distracting in class (as fashion clothing might be).

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school dressed correctly and ready for their daily schoolwork. We also ask parents to label all clothing with their child's name. This is especially important, as uniform items look similar and can easily be confused for another child's. The school cannot accept responsibility for any lost items.

Infants: Nursery, Reception, Years 1 and 2:

BOYS -

- Sky blue polo shirt embroidered with the school logo*;
- Dark grey trousers;
- Navy blue sweatshirt embroidered with the school logo*;
- Dark grey or black socks;
- Black traditional school shoes (no trainers, open-toed shoes or 'flashing shoes');
- Navy blue baseball cap*.

GIRLS -

- Sky blue polo shirt embroidered with the school logo*;
- Dark grey trousers or skirt;
- Navy blue sweat cardigan or sweatshirt embroidered with the school logo*;
- Dark grey pinafore dress, skirt or trousers;
- Dark grey or black tights, or white socks;
- Black traditional school shoes (no trainers, open-toed shoes, boots or 'flashing shoes');
- Navy blue baseball cap*.

Juniors: Years 3, 4, 5 and 6:

BOYS -

- White shirt and school tie*;
- Dark grey trousers;
- Navy blue knitted jumper embroidered with the school logo*;
- Dark grey or black socks;
- Black traditional school shoes (no trainers, open-toed shoes, or 'flashing shoes');
- Navy blue baseball cap*.

GIRLS -

- White shirt and school tie* or white V-neck blouse:
- Dark grey skirt or trousers;
- Navy blue knitted jumper or knitted cardigan embroidered with the school logo*;
- Dark grey or black tights, or white socks;
- Black traditional school shoes (no trainers, open-toed shoes, boots or 'flashing shoes');
- Navy blue baseball cap*.

PE (Infants & Juniors) -

- Sky-blue t-shirt (or polo shirt in the juniors) with the school logo*;
- Navy blue shorts.

Summer uniform can be worn between the start of the Summer Term in April through to the end of the first half-term in October. In summer, the girls may wear pale blue ¼" gingham, short sleeved dress. Dresses can be obtained from most high street stores including Marks & Spencer. Boys may also wear dark grey shorts in the summer.

Hairstyles and Accessories

Extreme hairstyles (eg sculptured names/symbols, tramlines, patterns, mohicans and dyed hair) are neither appropriate nor acceptable for children of primary school age. This also includes excessive use of hair products. It is essential to tie back long hair during the school day so that it does not distract children when working. Also loose hair causes greater problems with head lice.

Any hair accessories must match the school colours (navy blue or black) and must be plain and unobtrusive.

Jewellery

Jewellery must not be worn for safety reasons by pupils. Only small studs are suitable for pierced ears but must not be worn on days when the child has PE or swimming. Children will be expected to remove their studs should they come to school wearing them on these days, otherwise they will be asked to cover their studs with an elastoplast. Watches are worn at the owner's risk. The Governing Body are happy to endorse that children may wear a Cross but pinned on their School uniform like a badge. This way children can demonstrate their Christian beliefs, which we fully support, and at the same time meet the requirements regarding jewellery in the school's Health and Safety policy

Make up and Cosmetics

Make up and cosmetics, including nail vanish, are not considered appropriate or consistent with our school uniform. The school does not permit such products to be worn by any children, unless there is a specific event for which the Headteacher has given permission.
