
Term is well underway, and I have really enjoyed seeing the children come in to school smiling and ready to learn. Lots to look forward to – and lots already started.

PLEASE REMEMBER TO NAME EVERYTHING!!

We have already had a large number of items mislaid through the day and lots of them are not named. 30 navy jumpers all look identical when piled together!

PE KIT – Please make sure your child has their PE kit in school each week. It does not normally need to go home and can stay in school – we will send it home after a particularly muddy PE lesson if a wash is needed! Please provide Trainers for outdoor PE. Plimsols do not provide enough support and are not suitable for outdoor PE.

Hair and Earrings – Please ensure long hair is tied up (shoulder length is a good guide for when to tie up) and Earrings should not be worn on PE days (unless your child can remove them by themselves). Taping up is only suitable for the first six weeks of piercing or with a medical note to say the earring cannot be removed.

School Car Park

A member of staff's car was damaged in the school car park on Tuesday this week, towards the end of the day. Unfortunately, no note was left or message in school. Please take care if you use the car park to collect your child from Night Owls at the end of the day.

Please note the car park is not available to parents between 8am and 5pm when it is reserved for staff and visitors only.
