

Dear Parents/Carers,

There was a very European feel at All Saints last Friday, when the whole school celebrated European Day of Languages. EYFS and Key Stage 1 classes carried out language related activities in their classrooms and Key Stage 2 classes worked in mixed age House groups on different activities. The children learned to count and sing in different languages and also had a chance to design a menu in Italian. One of the highlights was a sign language activity during which the children had an opportunity to practise sign language skills with each other. It was great to see how enthusiastic all the children were about sharing their foreign language skills, whether they were complete beginners or competent speakers.

We are carrying on with celebrations for the whole of October, as the school marks the annual Black History Month. The whole school learned today about Frank Bailey, the first Black London fire-fighter and his enormous role in the history of Black fire-fighters in this country. I was immensely proud of the children's ability to recognise how Frank was treated unfairly at the early stages of his career and Kieren in Year 5 was quick to point out to the rest of the school how this was an example of racism and discrimination. The children reflected on what they could learn from Frank Bailey and how he is a role model to all of us today!

APPEAL FROM GOVERNORS

As you know, despite All Saints having to work within ever tightening budgets, over the last few years, the School has been able to invest in improvement works to all of the learning areas within the school as well as to the outside grounds, culminating over the Summer holidays with the replacement of the old doors and windows in the nursery; redevelopment of the back garden area in the nursery and redecoration as well as new blinds to the classrooms for Reception and Years 2 and 3. I am sure you would agree that the school has created a wonderful learning environment for all the children. There is only one area of the school that has not had any improvement works to it, which is the staff room. As well as being used for staff meetings, it is also the area where teachers should be able to have their PPA (Planning, Preparation & Assessment) non-contact time, as well as have their own lunch. The layout now makes it difficult to hold whole staff meetings and there is insufficient space for teachers to undertake their PPA time. This often results in teachers having to undertake this work in other areas of the school with the associated noise distractions. As Governors we feel that the staff deserve for this area to be improved and modernised to show appreciation for all their hard work. The School is currently undertaking an assessment of the costs to make those improvements and the Governors do hold some funds that have been generated from activities such as school lettings, but would like to make a request of the school community for anyone who would be able to offer their time, advice, skills, and/or resources to contribute to these works which will include a new kitchen area, new workstations, chairs and redecoration. If you are able to assist in any way to help with these works, please contact the School Office in the first instance. The Governors would be most appreciative of any help towards updating this very important area for the staff. Thank you.
