The disappointment felt when restrictions didn't lift on Monday is one all too familiar at the moment – life continues to be dominated by the pandemic and concern about the spread and impact on our community. Locally, there have been school bubble closures, and Public Health continue to be very concerned about the rise in case numbers.

Please continue to be vigilant – even with the vaccine rollout, pressure on local services is increasing, and any positive case in school will result in a closed bubble. The advice to schools has changed in light of the highly transmissible nature of the 'Delta' variant, meaning a slightly wider definition of those counted as 'close contacts' in school.

We have not yet had to close a class bubble – mainly due to the immense efforts of everyone in our community to do the right thing. Please continue to do this, follow the guidance and rules, so we can continue to keep coming in to school each day for the remainder of the term.

We continue to review our end of term plans – thankfully the trips already planned are mainly unaffected. Y6 end of year activities are (thankfully!) planned for after the 19th July, so we are very hopeful these will be able to include parents. Fingers crossed!

Our **Collective Worship** theme this week continued to explore our value of Understanding – recognising the unique qualities each of us bring to the community. The children considered the story of the 'Good Samaritan' – a very familiar biblical tale, but perhaps with a historical context we don't fully appreciate today. An equivalent would perhaps be one of an unexpected act of kind humanity despite significant political, cultural and religious differences that result in serious conflict. The story of the Good Samaritan aims to say we are people first, and as such need the kindness and love of others – just as God loves each of us.

So, please be kind to each other – even when there is conflict. We are all dealing with so much in our lives at the moment, and it is so important to show love and understanding.

Checking for COVID:

Please do not use Lateral Flow home tests to check for COVID when you or your child has any suspected symptoms (including a temperature, cough, loss of taste/smell).

The Government guidance states if someone has suspected symptoms, **they should use a PCR test to confirm if it is COVID**. A Lateral Flow home test is for routine asymptomatic (no symptoms) testing only.

Get a coronavirus test - GOV.UK (test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk).

If anyone in your household has suspected symptoms, the household must self-isolate for 10 days and seek a PCR test for the symptomatic person.

Please do tell us if there is a positive case so we can take appropriate actions to inform others and protect the community as a whole. Thank you.

We will always inform the school community if there is a positive case in school, and any further actions they may need to take. We will not share any personal details when we need to do this, in line with data protection rules.

The County Council have also asked us to make sure all parents are aware they can claim a **Test & Trace Payment** if they have to self-isolate, are then unable to work and meet certain other income related criteria – you don't necessarily have to be in receipt of benefits to be eligible!
