I'm confident that (all being well with the internet!) your session will be much smoother next week!!

Remote Learning - Responding to Pupil Work

The teachers are responding to work as soon as they can – just as you at home are balancing work/school/life, they too are trying to balance teaching in school and remotely, alongside all their other duties (which haven't stopped!) and family life. We will continue to do what we can.

It is most helpful if the children can try to upload something each day rather than 'bulk' submitting at the end of the week. This will mean your child is more likely to get a response to their hard work.

We are finding new ways to respond to pupil's work, and so over the next week or so some teachers may experiment with the different tools on Google Classroom. One of them is to use the 'Rubrics' function to create a bank of responses. Another is to record short messages (we like this one, it's quicker for us, and more personal!).

The children can leave comments too – either a 'Private' comment (which is just seen by the teacher), or a 'Class' comment (which can be seen by all the pupils as well). These are handy to let us know how they found the task or what was tricky.







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Daily Meet

We love seeing the children each day, and the response so far has been brilliant. Please do keep joining us for this key part of the day. Classes do different things each day, from playing a game together, or doing a dance, to practising counting or having fun with a sentence – as well as having chance to catch up and see each other.

It's also a really good opportunity to encourage your child to develop their independent technology skills, so do let them try to join the meeting themselves and find the mute/unmute button when they're asked to!

Online Safety

As we move online once more, it is even more important to ensure you are 'savvy' with your eSafety. Check your parental controls on your home internet services, and make sure your children know what to do if they come across something they shouldn't – can they recognise how to spot it? 
