OUR AIMS

Surrounded by God's love, we aim to achieve a **Nurturing** environment, building **Resilient** learners who **Achieve** excellence, helping children develop a firm foundation for their future life. In our school, everyone is respected and valued, so they can fully participate and do their best.

Our school is a welcoming, caring place that belongs to the whole community, firmly rooted in core Christian values – love of God and love of neighbour. These underpin the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of the children in our care.

OUR SCHOOL

All Saints Primary is a small Church of England School situated in generous grounds to the north of Bishops Stortford. We serve the local community by providing education for children aged 3 to 11 (Nursery to Year 6). Our pupils go on to attend a diverse range of local secondary schools in Bishops Stortford and beyond. We are part of the Bishops Stortford Consortium of Schools, and work closely with our local education partners to provide a broad and engaging curriculum.

THE JOURNEY BEGINS

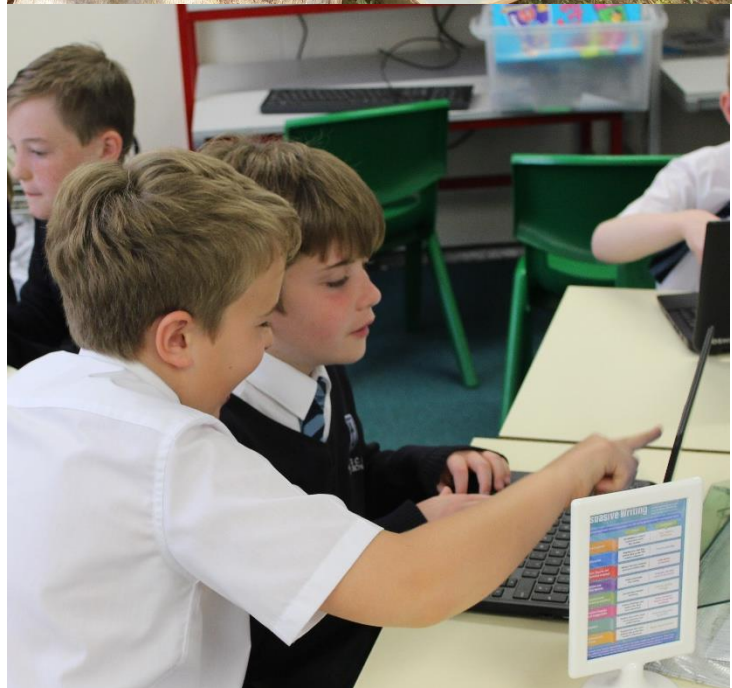
Our Early Years provision consists of Nursery and Reception, and this is where the majority of our children first experience life at our school. Nursery and Reception each have their own dedicated space, filled with stimulating and inspiring learning areas all geared towards helping them develop and refine their skills and confidence.

The curriculum in the Early Years is centred around the foundations of learning, taking inspiration from topics and pupils' own interests. The environment changes and adapts to the learning and ensures there is always something for them to do, whether it be learning numbers, letters or using their imagination in our role play and construction areas.

SETTLING IN & MOVING ON

In the term before starting in Nursery or Reception, pupils are invited into school for visits and our teachers will begin finding out about them and their interests. This helps them to become familiar with each other and the environment. Parents also complete 'All About Me' activities with their children and these are shared in school.

For pupils who are leaving us to go on to secondary school, we organise a taster day in the Summer Term. We regularly join in with sport festivals, activity days and competitions hosted by the secondary schools so children get a feel for what it may be like for them moving on, and also get to know pupils from other primary schools who will be in the same year group.





We place a large emphasis on Maths and English, and aim to use the curriculum imaginatively, engaging children in their learning and deepening their understanding.

CURRICULUM

Children are encouraged to be independent learners emphasising resilience and reflection as core to effective learning behaviours. Good behaviour is expected at all times, and is rewarded with house points, merits and 'Gold Slips'. We celebrate achievements – both curricular and social – as part of our weekly Celebration Assembly.

All children follow the National Curriculum, which is taught through creative themes that help children forge links between knowledge, skills and interest. These links embed learning so that it is deep, broad and experiential, involving forest school (taught weekly in EYFS and KS1), workshops, inspirational 'WOW Days', trips and residential visits, performing plays and learning to play musical instruments.

We work with the Birchwood School Sports Partnership and participate in a varied programme of events and activities with local schools. There is a strong drive to be Eco-aware, and we encourage all children to consider their impact on the environment.

Our School Council and Eco Council ensure pupils have a voice in how their school is run, and pupils are encouraged to be advocates for their interests – including charitable fundraising and campaigning for awareness of local and global issues.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION & CHURCH LINKS

As a Church of England school we follow a syllabus for RE which ensures that the faith of our school underpins our teaching. Through enquiry and questioning, children are taught about all main faiths, giving them a greater understanding of world faiths. Our children take part in daily collective worship which helps promote their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. We have good links with our parish church, All Saints, Hockerill, and regularly visit the church for learning and services – they also visit us!

CLASS ORGANISATION

Our school is organised into eight classes taught by a dedicated teacher. Teachers are supported by experienced teaching assistants and support staff who enable us to tailor provision to a personal level for pupils. We work through a flexible approach to grouping the children through the day, responding to their needs and the demands of the curriculum.



Children learn best when teachers and parents and carers work together, and we are proud to have parents who value their children's education and who participate in their learning.

STRONG PARTNERSHIPS

There is a strong, caring ethos in our school, and many visitors comment on the warm, welcoming environment we create for pupils, staff and parents. We operate an 'open door' policy – helping to build a strong partnership with our parents and carers. This partnership is vital to the success of our children, and we encourage parents to be actively involved with their children's education.

There are many and varied opportunities to be involved in school life, from sharing assemblies, to listening to readers and helping out in class – alongside a hugely supportive and active PTA.

All parents are automatically a member of the PTA and each year they organise a range of fun activities for all the family to help raise much needed funds for our school.

CHARITY PARTNERSHIPS

As a school we are delighted to support a wide range of charities, national and international. These have included Children in Need, NSPCC, The Poppy Appeal, The Bishop of St Alban's Appeals; Water Aid and Tearfund. Our PTA also choose a charity to support each year through sales of second hand uniform.

COMMUNICATION

We use a range of ways to communicate with our parents, for example through our fortnightly newsletter, website or face to face meetings. There is a wealth of information on our website including our newsletters, key policies and information.

Parents are invited to attend Parent Consultations in the Autumn and Spring Terms, and each child receives a written report in the Summer Term. Staff will always be happy to meet with parents and carers at any point through the year to share any concerns.



We take very seriously our responsibility for the all-round development of each and every child, and have robust systems in place to ensure their development needs are met.

CARING FOR YOUR CHILD

We are committed to creating a safe learning environment for all our pupils and staff, irrespective of race, gender, disability, faith, religion, or socio-economic background so that everyone at our school feels safe, valued and confident that they will be listened to.

We aim to develop a culture of inclusion and diversity in which all those connected to the school feel proud of their identity and able to participate fully in school life. We are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all our children. We expect all staff, volunteers and visitors to share this commitment.

The curriculum is designed to ensure opportunities for children to develop the skills they need to recognise and stay safe, including when using the internet. Children know that they can approach any of the adults in school if they are worried and that they will receive a consistent and supportive response.

CATERING FOR THE NEEDS OF ALL CHILDREN

We believe that every child is unique and special. Our approach ensures that the children's needs are met in the classroom. From time to time, we may need to ask other professionals to help us provide for children in our school. At every stage, we meet and discuss with parents our observations and the support we are putting in place to help your child achieve and succeed. CELEBRATING CHILDREN

We recognise fully that celebrating pupil's achievements and effort through rewards systems and certificates in school builds self-esteem and motivates. We share our rewards with the whole school community in our weekly Celebration Assembly, to which parents and family members are invited to join us and celebrate our successes.

Every child is a member of a House Team and they can earn house points for their day to day learning, behaviour and attitudes to each other. Our prestigious Merits are given to individuals for excellent work in class. Overtime, they lead to Awards and recognition of the hard work the children have put in to achieve well.

EXTENDING THE DAY

Our **Great Start Breakfast Club** is open to all children from Reception to Y6 from 7.50am each morning. A healthy breakfast and a range of activities are offered, alongside participation in the Daily Mile initiative.

We aim to provide our children with as wide a range of opportunity as possible, and through the year **After School Clubs** run after the school day to extend learning and interest.

We also work in partnership with **Little Ladybirds** for Nursery sessions in the afternoon (please contact them directly for places- contact details on our website).

Night Owls offer childcare on site until 6.30pm, Monday – Friday during Term Time.

ADMISSIONS- Joining our School

RECEPTION (4-6yrs)

We have 30 places available each year for our Reception class. Pupils are normally admitted in the September of the academic year in which they turn 5.

Admission forms must be completed via the Hertfordshire Admissions website.

NURSERY (3-4yrs)

In Nursery we have 24 part-time funded places available (15 hours a week).

Applications are made in Spring Term for the following September start, or ad hoc through the year if places are available.
