This week, we launched May as the 'Month of Walking'. We will be taking part in Walk to School Week – $17^{th} - 21^{st}$ May. During that week, we encourage the children to walk each day as part of their arriving at school. Perhaps parking a little further away from school and walking a little more, or even walking the whole distance! We'll be joining many schools across the country and I'll share more details next week.

I'm also delighted to start sharing some of the upcoming dates – of course many of these are dependent on restrictions being lifted, and the risk assessment required, and the weather... but it feels exciting to have some things to look forward to! At this point, I cannot say if parents will be allowed to attend as spectators for things like the Sports Day – but we will do what we can to share the day with you either way.

Traditionally Y6 parents arrange for the children to have an adventure activity at the end of the school year, to celebrate all they have achieved and have fun before they go off to secondary school. A letter is coming out soon with details of how this will work this year. We are also looking at the other end of year events and working out a way to make sure they can take place in some way.

We also usually have a Y5 residential. Although we have been unable to book a full week residential (the centre we used has now stopped offering the visits), Mrs Francis and Mrs Davidson are arranging an excellent week of outdoor activities and an overnight stay on the field. Details are in the letter being sent out today.

The children have asked if we will ever get to gather again as a whole school, altogether. Currently, we do these by video link each Friday afternoon, but it's just not the same. So... we're hoping to restart whole school celebration assemblies outside on the field after half term – each class sitting away from other classes, and me using some form of amplification to be heard!

Finally, I'm delighted to share that following the wet weather damage to the hall floor in January earlier this year, the insurers have agreed to replace the whole hall floor with a new one!

It's been a busy week of finalising projects and getting things underway.

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Child feeling unwell?

Check on the NHS website to see whether your child should be in school or not:

Is my child too ill for school? - NHS (www.nhs.uk)

Remember to complete a medication form (available here on our website) if your child needs to bring medication into school.

Checking for COVID:

Please do not use Lateral Flow home tests to check for COVID when your child has any suspected symptoms (including a temperature, cough, loss of taste/smell). The Government guidance states if someone has suspected symptoms, they should use a PCR test to confirm if it is COVID. A Lateral Flow home test is for routine asymptomatic (no symptoms) testing only and is currently not recommended for Primary age children.

Get a coronavirus test - GOV.UK (test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk).

If anyone in your household has suspected symptoms, the household must self-isolate for 10 days and seek a PCR test for the symptomatic person.

Please do tell us if there is a positive case so we can take appropriate actions to inform others and protect the community as a whole. Thank you.

We will always inform the school community if there is a positive case in school, and any further actions they may need to take. We will not share any personal details when we need to do this, in line with data protection rules.

The County Council have also asked us to make sure all parents are aware they can claim a **Test & Trace Payment** if they have to self-isolate, are then unable to work and meet certain other income related criteria – you don't necessarily have to be in receipt of benefits to be eligible! 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
News from the Classes:
