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Mental Health Awareness

Changes to Covid Guidance – 17th May

From Monday the rules about meeting indoors and outdoors change – groups from multiple households can meet outdoors, and up to two households or 6 people indoors. Please remember to be sensible – COVID is still in the community, and not everyone in our community has had the vaccine yet!

Although some rules have relaxed, there is little change to our school procedures and protocols. Therefore:

- Please continue to wear a mask on site they remain part of our school guidance and risk assessment to protect the most vulnerable (and we have some children/families for whom this is true). They're also good for preventing other viruses that are currently doing the rounds!
- Please keep a distance from other families Also good for preventing other viruses...
- The one-way system will remain in place.
- Staggered start times, lunch times, and collection times will remain in place.
- The Bubble System remains in place for all classes.
- Routine handwashing and enhanced cleaning procedures all remain in place.

Thank you for your help in keeping our school a safe place to learn and work.

Checking for COVID:

Please do not use Lateral Flow home tests to check for COVID when your child has any suspected symptoms (including a temperature, cough, loss of taste/smell). The Government guidance states if someone has suspected symptoms, they should use a PCR test to confirm if it is COVID. A Lateral Flow home test is for routine asymptomatic (no symptoms) testing only and is currently not recommended for Primary age children.

Get a coronavirus test - GOV.UK (test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk).

If anyone in your household has suspected symptoms, the household must self-isolate for 10 days and seek a PCR test for the symptomatic person.

We will always inform the school community if there is a positive case in school, and any further actions they may need to take. We will not share any personal details when we need to do this, in line with data protection rules.



In DT the children have used their knowledge of pneumatic action to create moving monsters! Be afraid, they might nibble you!! (Not really, but they are very good!)







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



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Wanted by Year 1
