This week, the children have continued to explore the theme of **Ascension** and the first 'Followers' of Jesus. This all leads up to **Pentecost** – celebrated in church this weekend, and next week our theme. Fr Simon has recorded a message to share with us on Monday too.

Walk to School week has helped to raise the profile of walking for exercise each day. I hope you found some of the suggestions helpful last week. Please do continue to use them!

The road outside school has become increasingly busy and difficult, particularly at the end of the school day. Please do take care! I've witnessed several families from our school crossing in dangerous places where children will not be seen – it is so important for you as parents to model safe and sensible behaviour to your children. Please do walk to the crossing where drivers will expect people to cross – it really doesn't add much to the time taken and could save you a lot of pain later. This week I witnessed a child running out in front of a car, just 5 meters away from the crossing. The driver managed an emergency stop, but it could have been much worse!

We've got a patch of overgrown **bramble** – I say patch, it's more like a jungle – along the edge of the field. We'd like to clear it to help keep the school fences in good order, and relations with our neighbours positive! We won't get all of it done in one go, but we can make a good start and work from there. If you'd be able and willing to help out – **3pm Friday 11**th **June** – please do let us know. You'll need sturdy footwear and clothing (including gloves). If you have tools that would be useful, please do bring them with you. We won't have access to power, and some of the brambles are pretty fearsome! Thank you.

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Checking for COVID:

Please do not use Lateral Flow home tests to check for COVID when your child has any suspected symptoms (including a temperature, cough, loss of taste/smell). The Government guidance states if someone has suspected symptoms, they should use a PCR test to confirm if it is COVID. A Lateral Flow home test is for routine asymptomatic (no symptoms) testing only and is currently not recommended for Primary age children.

Get a coronavirus test - GOV.UK (test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk).

If anyone in your household has suspected symptoms, the household must self-isolate for 10 days and seek a PCR test for the symptomatic person.

Please do tell us if there is a positive case so we can take appropriate actions to inform others and protect the community as a whole. Thank you.

We will always inform the school community if there is a positive case in school, and any further actions they may need to take. We will not share any personal details when we need to do this, in line with data protection rules.

The County Council have also asked us to make sure all parents are aware they can claim a **Test & Trace Payment** if they have to self-isolate, are then unable to work and meet certain other income related criteria – you don't necessarily have to be in receipt of benefits to be eligible!
