

One of the key priorities for the All Saints Governing body this academic year was to review the school vision and mission statements. A vision is the school's goal, a statement to indicate its values, behaviours and where we hope to see it in the future. Developing strong vision and mission statements can help everyone in a school's community to reach a common understanding. The mission provides an overview of how you achieve that goal.

Why have a school vision?

- To communicate your purpose.
- Your school must have a vision that all staff members recognize as a common direction of growth, something that inspires them to be better.
- An effective vision also announces to parents and students where you are heading and why they should take the trip with you.

Our starting point was to consider our existing vision and mission statements. Whilst both encompassed many of the key values of the school, they were long and wordy, making them difficult to understand by the students. Also, they were slightly out of date, as many of those involved in creating them are no longer part of the All Saints community. Consulting teachers, parents and of course the students would be vital in coming up with something relevant that accurately reflected All Saints today.

A questionnaire was used to gather the views of the school community. This was circulated to parents after class assemblies and also handed out at parents' evening, as we sought to get parents to articulate what All Saints meant to them. The questionnaire asked people to articulate the types of adjectives that came to mind when describing the school and what they liked most about it. Class teachers also ran the same exercise with all year groups to capture feedback from the students and it was brilliant to get so many overwhelmingly positive responses. Teaching staff were then consulted and their comments really helped to encapsulate the essence of the school.

We then considered all of the comments and observations and distilled them into what we hope is a set of values that really capture All Saints' unique feel. To give you a visual idea of the types of words and associations people had when asked about All Saints I've included a word cloud below.
